














#### **Rules for Exams**

Students must remain in classroom for 1 hour and 15 min. 9:00 – 10:15 a.m. All technology must be turned into the teacher before the exam.

Enter classroom prepared. 2 HB pencils, eraser, calculator (CELL PHONES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE CALCULATORS for Final Exams)

Remind students to use the washroom <u>before</u> the exam. Use during exam is at the teacher's discretion.

**TEXTBOOKS** must be returned to the librarian <u>before</u> exams. All markings should be erased prior to handing in to alleviate damage costs.

If a student is ill, a parent/guardian must phone the school office first thing in the morning. Make-up exams will be held in the afternoons up to June  $23^{rd}$  for Grades 6-9.

On days where students have no scheduled exams, there are no planned activities for that grade in the school. They are not expected to attend school on those days.

<u>With parent's permission</u>, after their exams, students are allowed to sign out and leave the school <u>only if</u> they have no other 'class' exams or assignments to turn in. Students remaining in school are not permitted to roam the hallways. Students will remain in their homeroom for quiet review, assignment completion and studying.

If, for any reason, parents/guardians want to excuse their child from the afternoon review/study time, you must provide a <u>written note</u> excusing him/her. Parents are reminded that by sending a note, they take full responsibility for their child's activities during that time. If students are excused, they are not allowed back on any school property in the division. This includes taking the bus, picking up books and playing sports outside.

<u>WRITTEN PERMISSION</u> must be given to the office **PRIOR** to the student leaving the school or your child will be considered to be skipping and subject to consequences. Students will **NOT** be allowed to call home for permission to leave the school.

#### Central Office Leadership Team Changes for 2023-24

St. Paul Education is pleased to announce Mr. Steve Schaar as new Associate Superintendent of Human Resources effective August 2023. The Division has been operating without a dedicated human resources lead for over 600 employees. The addition of this role will benefit staff relations, recruitment and professional development. There will also be reorganization of the current Central Office Leadership Team to include two Associate Superintendents, Mr. Keith Gamblin and Mr. Steve Schaar. Mrs. Sha Tichkowsky and Mrs. Karol Cabaj-Martin will serve in Director roles.

#### Summer School

St. Paul Alternate Education Centre is providing summer school for interested students. The school is in the final stages of developing courses. More information is expected to be released before the end of May.

#### Saddle Lake Busing Notice

Saddle Lake Education Authority has announced that effective June 30, 2023, busing for students in Kindergarten and Grades 1-3 will no longer be provided to off-reserve schools. According to their release, the plan is to phase out Grade 4-12 busing by 2025. The Division is determining how this will impact enrollment and staffing.

#### Financial Update

A budget report to the end of April was presented indicating that the Division is tracking as expected. The final 2023-2024 budget meeting will be held on May 29. Significant budget assumptions that still need confirmation include federal enrollment and tuition funding.

#### **Excellence in Catholic Education Award**

Congratulations to Amanda Amyotte who was the recipient of this award on Saturday, April 29 at the SPICE Retreat.

#### Honouring Spirit Indigenous Student Award

Congratulations to Easton Patenaude, a Grade 6 student at Elk Point Elementary School, for receiving this award. We would also like to congratulate our 31 students who received honorable mentions.

#### Mallaig Design Letter

The Division received a letter from the Government of Alberta advising that the École Mallaig School has been approved for design funding as part of the school capital approval announcements made at the beginning of March. Work will begin once the delivery method has been determined.

#### Inclusive Education

Sha Tichkowsky gave a presentation about inclusive education in our school division. Topics included tiered supports, speech and language supports, occupational therapy, as well as literacy & numeracy interventions.
